A PASTORAL LETTER FROM BISHOP **DENIS NULTY** "Put out into the Deep Water"

Over the next three weeks we will be printing extracts from Bishop Denis Nulty's letter.

Dear Priests, Deacons, Religious and Lay Faithful.

Working Together in our Pastoral Areas/Parish Clusters:

When Fr. Paddy Sweeney spoke at the Diocesan Clergy Gathering in Athlone in January 2020 he said "this is a moment requiring a different way of thinking, a different way of talking and a different way of acting". I am now offering 19 more localized parish clusters, some of them crossing different Pastoral Areas. The 19 parish clusters are offered as an ad experimentum arrangement. These are the clusters that have emerged out of those initial Pastoral Area meetings.

It is important to give these clusters every support. I don't see huge changes coming to the attached map; there may be slight tweaking, but this is the clustering within the wider Pastoral Area(s) that your parish will operate in from now on. I am asking that discussions be held at first at parish level with lay people, within the parish cluster and then in the Pastoral Area to make sure that the clustered parishes are operable and

correctly assigned. I am asking that responses come back to me regarding the parish clustering proposal by October 15th.

The prophet Amos reminds us of our duty not to exploit the poor and needy while in today's Gospel St. Luke tells us that we cannot serve both God and money. If we serve God, then, we will not forget today's victims of poverty.





If you think that all the parables of Jesus are pleasant stories about people of integrity, then today's gospel might make you think again. In this story, a manager has been given his notice by his CEO and decides, while he still can, to even up the tables for those who are struggling to

pay their debts to the company. He uses the power he still has to change the future for these debtors - and for himself. The only value the money really has is in the way it is used. He is squandering money, but he is not squandering opportunities. During this Season of Creation, we are called to look at our lifestyles and to see how we are using the resources which have been gifted to us and which are on loan to us. Are we squandering them? Are we walking gently on the earth? Are we thinking of those who are on the front lines of climate change and biodiversity loss? The manager in the Gospel today is up to holy mischief, doing what he can to even up the tables for those who are struggling and changing the course of the future for the debtors. The environmental crises our world is now facing requires a similar response. Young people are crying out to us to safeguard their futures. While we share what we can with those who are suffering, we must also address the root causes of what is crushing them. May we respond to Pope Francis' call to listen to the cry of the earth and the cry of the poor. May we live our vocation to be protectors of God's handiwork and walk more gently on this earth.
