

HISTORY OF ALL SAINTS DAY

Remembering saints and martyrs and celebrating their lives on a particular day each year has been a Christian tradition since the 4th century AD.

In 837AD, Pope Gregory IV extended the festival to remember all the saints, changed its name to Feast of All Saints and fixed the date to 1st November.

HISTORY OF ALL SOUL'S DAY
Praying for the dead is an ancient Christian
tradition. In 998AD Odilo, Abbot of Cluny
(France), set aside a specific day for
remembering and praying for those in
Purgatory. This started as a local feast in his
monasteries and gradually spread throughout
the Catholic Church towards the end of the
10th century AD.



rocus on sunday

God loves everything he creates; nothing he makes is evil. Similarly he

loves and befriends each of his people and the gospel story is of Jesus'

friendship with a man whom everyone else looked down on.



Today's gospel gives a good insight into acceptance, repentance, and conversion. Zacchaeus used his position to overcharge tax and pocket the proceeds from the Romans. Everyone knew it was happening but, as in many cases of greed, nobody could

do anything! By the grace he received from Jesus; he knew he could change. So, he confessed his wrongdoing, in public. He went further by saying he would make amends by paving back what he defrauded – what we would call restitution. He followed this with a sign that he had changed his mind and heart - he would give away property to the poor.

We sometimes wait for an apology and restitution in cases where people, especially the poor, have been affected by greed and often criminal use of financial resources. We await a new way of proceeding with our banks and other financial institutions. Too often, in the modern world, long legal cases are necessary before ordinary people get what is due to them. In our everyday lives, an apology can often be followed by a gift or some sign, more than words, of sorrow.

When Zacchaeus "saw what kind of man Jesus was" he also saw clearly what kind of man he was himself. Jesus granted him the grace to see the need for change and the strength and courage to repent and to change. The life of Jesus appeals to the best in us as he appealed to the best in Zacchaeus, both to confess our wrongdoing and make it up to those we have wronged.

Lord, forgive us and help us forgive, or pray, for those who have harmed us.
