



Third Day

There is something about the third day. There was a wedding feast in Cana on the third day, and on the third day of Calvary would be the resurrection. It means something big, something

good will happen that day.

It is a day of hope as we are also people of hope. There will always be a third day –all else will pass. Hope in the resurrection of Jesus is that nothing except love of each other and the love of God is lasting. Our hope of his coming in glory can help us in a time of trouble.

We know that in all bad times, but some good things can happen within them. Our suffering can change us, can make us better people. The third day comes in here. Jesus knew of suffering ahead of him and the friends. He knows suffering in our loves – think what suffering we meet with sudden death in the family. Of the homeless begging on the streets and needing the active help of people to finance them or find them a home. In my work we get hundreds of letters each month asking for prayer.
