

LACKAGH GRAVEYARD MASS & REDEDICATION OF PLAQUE

On Wednesday 11th June 2025 at 7.30pm the Annual Gravevard Mass will take place in Lackagh, where we remember and pray for our dearly departed especially those interred in the Graveyard. Following Mass there will be a special event. Most Reverend Bishop Denis Nulty, Bishop of Kildare & Leighlin Diocese and his Excellency Cleviston Haynes the Barbados Ambassador to Ireland, will rededicate the restored ommemorative Plaque on the old Church wall which marks the centuries old connection between the Parish and Caribbean Island. The Plaque was originally unveiled on the ruins of the old church in Lackagh Graveyard on Sunday 4th October 1959.

rocus on sunday FIFTH SUNDAY OF EASTER The call of the risen Lord to love one another is the call to all his people to hand on their faith to each other and promote justice in our society.





Today's Gospel stands at the intersection between the old world of rules, regulations, and laws which Jesus was born into, and ushers in the age of compassionate, tender, unconditional love which we have been baptised into.

The language of glory was important for the audience Jesus was speaking to, as glory was associated with the powerful in society: the Roman rulers, the high priests, the rich. Yet the glorification Jesus speaks of is not a show of might or power: this is different kind of glory, where the lowliest of the land are glorified and raised up by the Lord through love. The Biblical concept of glory is very nuanced, and derives from various Hebrew and Greek usages of the word. While the Hebrew word kabod signifies the glory of God as seen in physical phenomena such as thunder and lightning, the Greek doxa refers to the divine characteristics of brightness, beauty, and sovereignty. The New Testament takes the word from the Jewish Scriptures and revolutionises it by applying it to the Cross, the most degrading and lowly public penitentiary act of the time.

Christ's love re-interprets the word 'commandment', as it is born out of selfsacrifice, reaching those who are burdened, who are suffering, who need to be glorified. We see in the world today how glory and love are often polarised, and can ask ourselves: who is being glorified in our society today? Who is being shown love? And where do I stand as a Christian?
