

GOSPEL Luke 10:1 - 12. 17-20. (\*Shorter form in italics 10:1-9\*) A reading from the holy Gospel according to Luke.

\* The Lord appointed seventy - two others and sent them out ahead of him, in pairs,

to all the towns and places he himself was to visit. He said to them, 'The harvest is rich but the labourers are few, so ask the Lord of the harvest to send labourers to his harvest. Start off now, but remember, I am sending you out like lambs among wolves. Carry no purse, no haversack, no sandals. Salute no one on the road. Whatever house you go into, let your first words be, "Peace to this house!" And if a man of peace lives there, your peace will go and rest on him: if not, it will come back to you. Stay in the same house, taking what food and drink they have to offer, for the labourer deserves his wages; do not move from house to house. Whenever you go into a town where they make you welcome, eat what is set before you. Cure those in it who are sick, and say, "The kingdom of God is very near to you."\*

But whenever you enter a town and they do not make you welcome, go out into its streets and say, "We wipe off the very dust of your town that clings to our feet, and leave it with you. Yet be sure of this: the kingdom of God is very near." I tell you, on that day it will not go as hard with Sodom as with that town.'

The seventy - two came back rejoicing. 'Lord,' they said,'even the devils submit to us when we use your name.' He said to them, 'I watched Satan fall like lightning from heaven. The mission of every follower of Christ is to be a peacemaker.





Harvesting usually involves reaping a crop or bounty of some kind. We think of strawberry fields where we gather heaps of sweet fruit, or sunflower farms where we come away laden with armfuls of flowers. The harvesting in today's Gospel is, to all

intents and purposes, the opposite of this. The seventy-two will not reap quantities of produce to enjoy. Their harvest is a more intangible one: they are harvesting souls for God, followers of Christ who will share his peace, love, and healing power with all they meet. And they bring no physical tools for this work, nor even the necessary equipment. Part of their process is to come with nothing, and to give everything.

This is Jesus' journey to Jerusalem, and even before the widely understood institution of the Eucharist at the Last Supper, we see him appointing the seventy-two in persona Christi. They carry out the work he himself does: healing, preaching, breaking bread. We often think only of the disciples carrying out Jesus' work, but there were many more, and Jesus is providing a kind of internship here. And he sends them ahead of him, as a powerful symbol of his collegial and collaborative leadership.

The model for ecclesial renewal could not speak more starkly to us today. As Jesus understood the importance of not doing it all himself, we need to have faith in our labourers and, equally, believe that there is a rich harvest still available for us to reap.
