PRAYERS IN THE GRAVEYARD



In this life you embraced them with your tender love; deliver them now from every evil and give them eternal rest.



It is not easy to die even for a good man - though of course for someone really worthy, a man might be prepared to die – but what proves that God loves us is that Christ died for us while we were still sinners. Having died to make us righteous, is it likely that he would now fail to save us from God's anger? When we were reconciled to God by the death of his Son, we were still enemies; now that we have been reconciled, surely we may count on being saved by the life of his Son? Not merely because we have been reconciled but because we are filled with joyful trust in God, through our Lord Jesus Christ, through whom we have already gained our reconciliation.

All Souls Day is a day we meet to remember all who have died, especially during the past year. It is good to remember our dead, and to be grateful for their lives. We do so that, in the context of faith which gives us a meaning to death, and in prayer with them on their journey to the full happiness of Heaven, as they

pray for us.

Jesus shared in death and also in the bereavement in his family, as family members and neighbours died. He is God made man, and offers not an answer but a meaning to death. It is a meeting with God, a homecoming, an entry into a totally new way of life. And we don't understand it. It is a welcome from God, whose house 'has many rooms'.

There is always sadness and gap at death, especially when loved ones in the family die. These are the people who knew us and loved us from the first moment of life, and whom we learned basic lessons of life. It is in the family we learn of love, care, forgiveness, tolerance – everything that is necessary for a life of love.

They have gone before us, to where we are all headed. We talk of them waiting for us, to welcome us into the vision of God, and share the joy of eternal life. We light candles for them, in our faith in the resurrection.

At our death we bring with us the loves of our life - and so something of ourselves go with them in this link of heaven and earth. While the day is a sad day in many ways, let it be also a day of gratitude for the gift in our lives they have been
